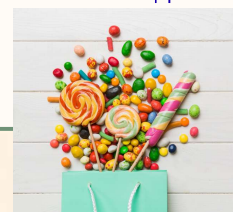
- Tuesday 19th May - Cricket Day - please ensure all children have their PE kits today.
