Our Uniform



Our school uniform is as follows:

- Royal blue jumper or cardigan (with or without the logo)
- White polo shirt
- Grey trousers, skirt or pinafore
- Grey uniform shorts or a blue gingham school dress in warmer weather.
- Plain grey or black tights
- All black shoes or trainers

PE and Sports Clubs



Children come to school dressed in their PE kit on their allocated PE and sports club days.

- Royal blue, round neck t shirt (with or without logo)
- Black shorts, jogging bottoms or leggings. (Black based layer "skins" may be worn under shorts in cooler weather)
- A black or navy tracksuit for cooler weather.
