The rights and responsibilities of staff, parents and children

We aim for teachers and staff, parents and children to work together as partners in order to provide the best education for our children. To achieve this, we need shared ideas of what is expected of us.

This document is designed to clearly set out responsibilities, rights and duties of all involved with the education of the children at Tetney Primary School. Please read it carefully with your child, sign one of the copies and return it to school. Please retain the other copy for your records.

Parents

1. Parents have the **right** to expect their children to have an education which enables them to maximize their life chances and achieve their full potential.
Parents have the **responsibility** to support the school in ensuring that children take full advantage of all learning opportunities on offer and do nothing that damages the learning opportunities of others.
2. Parents have the **right** to expect their children to be educated in a secure, calm and caring environment, free from any kind of discrimination.
Parents have the **responsibility** to support the school in maintaining a secure, calm and caring environment.
3. Parents have the **right** to expect their children to have well planned , properly resourced lessons, which begin promptly and end on time.
Parents have the **responsibility** to make sure their children attend school regularly and punctually, and to provide reasons for any absences by letter or telephone.
Parents are responsible for ensuring their children are at school on time and that they collect them on time.
4. Parents have the **responsibility** to assist with the homework when appropriate and to ensure it is returned to school on time.
5. Parents have the **right** to clear information about the school curriculum and policies, their children's progress, any special education provision and to be consulted on any concerns over behaviour, attendance or other matters.
Parents have the **responsibility** to support their child's learning by attending Parent's Meetings and to inform the school of any concern.

1. The school has a **responsibility** to offer an education which enables children to maximise their life chances and achieve their full potential.
Teachers have the **right** to be free to teach without disruption in order to fulfil this **responsibility**.
2. The school has a **responsibility** to create a secure, calm, caring environment where issues are tackled in a positive way. The school has a **responsibility** to aim the curriculum at developing children who take responsibility for their role in the school community.
Staff have the **right** to expect support from parents and children in pursuing this aim which is to the advantage of all.
3. Teachers have a **responsibility** to ensure that their lessons are well planned, properly resourced and accessible to all children, and begin on time and end promptly. The school has a **responsibility** to keep parents informed if a child is often late or has poor attendance.
Teachers have the **right** to expect children to attend regularly and punctually and for any absences to be explained by a note or telephone.
4. Teachers have a **responsibility** to ensure that appropriate homework is set for their children, accompanied by advice to parents when necessary. They have a duty to promptly mark and feedback on homework, as appropriate.
Teachers have the **right** to expect homework to be completed and for it to be returned on time.
5. Teachers have the **responsibility** to keep parents informed of their children's progress and specific concerns that may arise.
Teachers have the **right** to expect a response from parents when requesting a meeting to resolve any issues that may arise.
